



Monetary Policy and International Finance Program February 22 – April 9, 2022

Hybrid Format

The program is delivered in a highly interactive hybrid mode in which you can expect active live engagement with faculty and peers whether you are joining via zoom or in-person. You can choose to either do the program 100% via zoom or in the hybrid mode in which half of the lectures are going to be delivered in Beijing, and the other half via zoom when you accept the admissions decision and confirm your enrollment.

Time Commitment

You can anticipate a commitment of approximately four to six hours per week. This weekly estimate is based on three hours of live lecture, two hours for assignments/coworking time, and one hour of live office hours with faculty and teaching assistants.

Office Hours

Live office hours accommodate various time zones and schedules of working professionals. You can anticipate live office hours to be held in the evening of Central Standard Time/morning of China Standard Time.
